Since 1999, the National Spasmodic Dysphonia Association, now Dysphonia International, takes great pleasure in bestowing the **Midge Kovacs Annual Awareness Award**. Midge started one of the first SD support groups. She wrote a newsletter to share information about SD and the experiences of people living with SD. In presenting the Midge Kovacs Annual Awareness Award, we honor the outstanding work of a Dysphonia Support Group. This presentation marks our 25th consecutive presentation. For her work in 2022 and years prior, this year's award is given to **Toni Gold** and the **Greater Los Angeles Dysphonia Support Group.** Truly, this dynamic group follows in the footsteps of the late pioneering SD advocate, **Midge Kovacs.** This is the first award under the organization's new name.

In the 2018 4th quarter issue of *Voices of Support* newsletter, we selected Toni Gold as an SD Champion. Toni has developed relationships with healthcare professionals and SD patients alike. In 2018, she helped to organize an Educational Seminar on SD with **Dr. Michael Johns** and his USC colleagues. She continues to host interesting virtual meetings. Toni led a Walk for Talk event in 2020, 2021, and 2022. In addition, she was able to have articles placed in the media about her dysphonia journey, which raised further awareness about spasmodic dysphonia and related voice conditions. An article about Toni published last year states that she has had spasmodic dysphonia for 50 years and that she does not let it define her. She shares her story in order to comfort others with the same disorder.
